

3- Registers

Each department has created a list of criteria that an Able and Ambitious student is expected to demonstrate in their subject and selected approximately 5% of each cohort in Years 7-11 that are currently exhibiting these traits. This register will be reviewed twice over the course of each academic year. Unlike many other schools, selection reflects current behaviours observed in the classroom rather than being solely based upon data and prior achievement. 2- High Flyers Foundation Study (KS4)

All students identified on the Able and Ambitious programme complete the following:

- 1- Students complete their EtonX course during one form time a week, helping to develop soft skills for the High Flyers programme, Post 16:
 - Year 10 = Creative problem solving
 - Year 11 = Interview skills Y
 - ear 12 = Making an Impact
 - Year 13 = Critical Thinking
- 2- Students receive support from the educational psychologist twice a year; these sessions differ depending on student needs.
- 3- Students receive a separate Sixth Form invitation day from R.Gunn, S.White and S.Leithhead to explain the High Flyers programme and what exciting opportunities lie ahead.
- 4- Students work with our Careers Advisor to find the best possible routes towards their next destination.

1- High Flyers Programme

The High Flyers program supports students who are interested in applying to any course that requires an early application: Oxbridge subjects, Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary.

Students are guided through every step of this process - starting in Year 12 - where they develop the skills, experience and knowledge needed to ensure success in their applications. As part of this journey, we provide:

- Guest speakers, including past and present Oxbridge students
- Guidance on wider reading
- Work Experience opportunities
- Personal Statement guidance and enhanced checking and feedback
- Workshops for entrance examinations, including UCAT and BMAT
- Interview practice both within and outside of school
